CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell would move to return. That amendment is on 2062.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: It is not necessary. It is a great idea but we are compromising today.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You want to withdraw? It is withdrawn. Anything else on the bill?

CLERK: No, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. Move on to 981A. Anything to do with it? LB 1076.

CLERK: (Read LB 1076 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 2203 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 11 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 5 present and not voting, President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 1076 passes. LB 1064, we go back to that.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have the motion offered by Senator Lamb this morning to 1064. I believe copies of the amendment have been distributed.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members, I would renew the motion to bring the bill back to Select File for the specific amendment to try to settle the squabble between the
