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because he has the mortgage on the cattle. Even if the banker would give up that lien for the feed as the bill is right now, and I couldn't see any reason why they would but they might, if they did, I suggest the feed dealer could probably still go back to the banker eventually if the feeder couldn't pay. Well, putting this in, we are going to protect that banker. One more time we are going to protect bankers and make dang sure that they won't get stuck. Senator Lamb said it was a double jeopardy, he wanted to make sure it wasn't double jeopardy, well, I can understand why the bankers are for this particular piece of legislation to make sure that they don't have double jeopardy. They didn't particularly care if it is the farmers that are stuck under double jeopardy but they want to make certain they are not. So we are going to say here that that banker who is loaning money to both of them will be more apt to give up that right for that first lien to the feed dealer and say, well, you go collect it from the feeder because I know you are not going to come back to get me and then I am going to be protected anyway because I have got the mortgage on the cattle. I think this whole situation is ridiculous and I certainly don't like to put something in the law one more time to make certain that we nail some people that really don't need to be nailed. Now the livestock feeding industry, and we talk a lot on this floor and we have had bills in here that people have stood up and said, hey, we can't do away with gasohol exemptions and all those types of wonderful things because the corn farmers need all the help they can get and I don't hear too many people talking about doing something for the livestock industry, the cattle feeders, that are feeding that corn. Sometimes people tend to forget that it is a feed grain after all. Now some people might like to eat cornflakes but you don't eat enough cornflakes to use up the millions of bushels of corn that we raise in this country but almost everybody likes to eat beefsteak...
