LB 826, 848

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move the bill be readvanced to E & R engrossing.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Recess until eleven o'clock.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lamb, just a minute. We will need a little more time than that to start with. Okay, the motion is that we recess until eleven o'clock and that is a machine vote. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. No, it is not debatable. You are voting to recess until eleven o'clock. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to recess.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I have four bills lined up that we will be considering. They are in this order, 956, 660, 906 and 150. Okay, do you have a motion on 848?

CLERK: Senator, do you want to run that motion on 848? Senator Beutler would move to return 848, Mr. President. (Beutler amendment appears on page 2283 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: This will be the end of the motions.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this is almost an inconsequential amendment. It cuts down on the number of advance copies that are given of the advance sheets to different individuals but the reason that I wanted to run the amendment quickly is that it provides for advance copy of the Supreme Court reports to the Clerk of the Legislature who is not currently getting them and who really should get them and I would move the adoption of the amendment.
