SPEAKER NICHOL: The Wesely amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely...(Wesely amendment appears on pages 2285-2286 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, the next amendment comes from Jack Vetter and the nursing homes. It provides an exemption when you just give stock in your nursing home to like a son or a daughter, so you don't have to go through a process of review. It is another exemption from CON.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any discussion on the amendment? The question is the adoption of the second Wesely amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Wesely's second amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Wesely amendment is adopted. Anything else on it?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Wesely, is that your bill? Do you want to do anything with it?

SENATOR WESELY: Move it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You have heard the motion. Any discussion? All those favor of advancing the bill say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. We have an A bill.

CLERK: 906A, Senator.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: \$1,300.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion is to advance the A bill. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. Senator Barrett, for what purpose do you arise?
