ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read as found on pages 2339-2340 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 38 ayes, 8 nays, 2 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 970A is declared passed. The next is LB 1078 with the emergency clause.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 1078 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1078 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Please record your vote on LB 1078. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on pages 2340-2341 of the Legislative Journal.) 46 ayes, 0 nays, 2 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 1078 is declared passed. Next we have motions for bills to be read for rule suspension. The Clerk has another motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell would move that the Legislature reconsider their actions on the final passage of LB 809.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, LB 809 is the homestead bill that failed this morning on Final Reading and I was not here and I apologize to the members who were here but it was my impression that the first bill would take longer than it did. I got here at nine o'clock. I would like to have a chance to vote on the bill and the reconsideration motion takes 30 votes. The bill would not have to be read again and that is the motion,
