PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move to suspend the rules so that we can read the rest of the bills today that are on your agenda. Because of the one day rule this will be necessary. So I ask for your support. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to suspend the rules to take up bills that are listed that need to be acted on. All those in favor...is there discussion? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. 30 votes required. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 0 nays on the suspension, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. The rules have been suspended. Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, thank you. Ladies and gentlemen, some have been asking if we are going to break for lunch and the answer is yes, we are going to break for lunch at approximately noon and the other thing is that I suggest we take up this 1106 of Senator Schmit's at this time, then continue on with the agenda. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Without objection we will take up LB 1106.

CLERK: (Began reading LB 1106 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner. Excuse me, Senator Warner, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, just a comment that 1106 does contain language suggesting an appropriation and I think the body should be aware that the interpreting the...well I doubt seriously if it is a valid appropriation. In interpreting the law consistent with our rules which are very clear that any...under Rule 5, Section 6, that any bill required appropriation shall have an A bill accompanying it which the bill does so that the...1106 itself takes 25 votes and the A bill, of course, takes 30 but I thought perhaps I
