PRESIDENT MCGINLEY PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: Would members of the Legislature please report to the Legislative Chamber for the beginning of the afternoon session. Roll call is in progress. The Clerk will record the roll.

ASSISTANT CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A quorum present. The Legislature is in session for the afternoon. First the Chair would announce that Senator Fenger of Bellevue has 12 members of the Bellevue Welcome Wagon Association as his guests under the north balcony and Senator Vickers has in the north balcony guests who are 11 eighth grade students from St. Patrick's School in McCook accompanied by Superintendent and Pastor, Father Hain. Welcome, all, to the Legislature today. The Chair might explain to the students who are guests in the gallery today that it is not likely you will hear very much debate today because this is the second to the last day of the session and we are engaged primarily in reading bills on Final Reading. That means that these bills have been introduced, considered by a committee and heard for the public and debated on the floor and are now here for final consideration and when they get 25 votes or 30 votes in case of an appropriation they are enacted into law. Does the Clerk have anything for the record? Go ahead.

CLERK: No, I'd better not. No, no, I don't, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay. We proceed then to LR 227.

CLERK: (Read LR 227 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LR 227 be enacted into law? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Please record your vote on LR 227. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.
