SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 2419 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 44 ayes, 1 nay, 2 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is declared passed. The Clerk would like to read some things in.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first item I have to read in is a explanation of vote by Senator Higgins.

And, Mr. President, I have a series of messages from the Governor. The first item I have, Mr. President, is a message from the Governor on 568 and 568A. (Read.) The second message I have, Mr. President, is from the Governor. (Read. Re: LB 970A.) The third, Mr. President, is addressed to Dear Senators. (Read. Re: LB 962.)
