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very upset about what somebody said about his district. Well, I am just as angry and upset about his reference to "Drunken Farmers". I think it was poor taste, but I can understand why he would say it because this is the way his context, the way he says things. So I just wonder sometimes maybe we ought to have legislation to protect us against "Drunken Farmers". So I resent his reference to "Drunken Farmers". Don't like it. And, Senator Chambers, I am going to ask you not to do it in the future. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hoagland. Excuse me, gentlemen, let's... (Gavel)... let's hold it down, gentlemen, so we can hear Senator Hoagland speak. Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I would like to rise in support of this motion. Let me point out initially, as Senator Beutler has already, that this bill is by no means limited to Tempe. This bill has ramifications that go far beyond it and will allow triple trailers on the roads of this state far beyond those manufactured in this plant in Senator Schmit's district. Now they are all... about these allegations that there is no safety question involved, let me relate to you my experiences in driving to Lincoln to come down here. You know, there have been about six or seven days when we have had to drive down from Omaha where we have had adverse weather conditions, where we had a couple inches of snow the night before or the day before and there has been packed snow on the road, or the packed snow and a combination of wet snow and so forth. Now every single time we have come down this session with those kinds of conditions, and there have been five or six, there have been a couple of trucks off the road. The last time we came down which was after that four-day break, it was on Tuesday, March 20th, we had gotten two or three inches of snow in Omaha the twenty-four hours before and there were three, there were three large trucks off the road, two of them flat on their sides looking like big whales. And I just can't understand how day after day, week after week when there is snow on the ground we will drive those fifty short miles from Omaha to Lincoln and there will be these trucks off the road.
