SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Howard Peterson, did you wish to close? Okay, the question is, shall the bill pass notwithstanding the action taken by the Governor? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. It requires 30 votes. Please return to your seats. We are supposed to be under Call and we are wandering all over. It certainly would be a little easier if you would remain in your seats. These come pretty fast. Have you all voted that care to? Senator Howard Peterson.

SENATOR H. PETERSON: Mr. Chairman, I would ask for a Call of the House. Apparently some of the people have left and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. Will you please return to your seats and check in please so we can have a roll call vote. Thank you. Look up on the board to see if your name has a green light beside it so we can...so I don't have to call all of your names, please. Please record your light up here, your green light. Thank you. Senator Pirsch and Senator Chambers, Senator Lamb, Senator Schmit, Senator Rupp. We are still looking for Senator Chambers and Senator Schmit. Please remain in the Chamber so that we can conclude this. Senator Schmit and Senator Chambers, you are holding up the works. Please come back to the Chamber, please. Senator Howard Peterson, Senator Chambers is the only one here (sic.) or do you want to wait? He is here now. The reverse order has been asked for so we are voting on the override of the bill. (Gavel.) Please hold it down so the Clerk can hear your response. Thank you.

CLERK: (Roll call vote read as found on pages 2449-2450 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on the override.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is by Senator Newell. Senator Newell would move that LB 809 would become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.
