LB 568

SENATOR HANNIBAL: What your point is that we are on a suspension of the rule vote and a resolution?

SPEAKER NICHOL: And a motion by Senator DeCamp for his portion. That is what we are on, one vote, 30 votes, and you suspend the rules and vote on that all at one time.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: And you have made a ruling that that is a proper combination, is that correct?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, that is right and the Clerk helped me.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, I meant to save some time here so it looks like it isn't going to do it so, therefore, I'll withdraw my motion. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Now we are back to the square zero. Would you all please turn your lights off please. Okay, we are going back to overrides since there is nothing before us and we have one or two left.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is by Senator Vickers. Senator Vickers would move that LB 568 would become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, I don't harbor any great illusions. The hour is late. There are some folks that want to go to a party, want to get out of here, really don't care whether we complete our business or not, really don't care whether we deal with any of these issues or not, just as soon let the Governor have his way on some issues but I am not one of them. I don't care if we stay here until midnight. It is fine with me. I think we have got some things we ought to do. 568 is a bill that this body debated at length and decided that you obviously think that vocational education is important. We decided that

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
