Now we are back to the point number two on the Lamb amendment to resolution 2. Senator Vickers, were you the last to speak on that point? We had just...Had we just adopted resolution 1, or what? Senator Lamb, I think it would be wise for you to present this portion of the amendment again to the members. May we have order please. (Gavel.) Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you, Mr. President, members, just to review we are discussing Senator Vickers's meritorious resolution which is found on page 73 of the Journal, which would ask that 20 members of the Legislature go to Washington in regard to the farm crisis. I offered the amendment, which you remember we adopted, which would make the Speaker the leader of this group. I am highly supportive of the amendment. I do have this other amendment that we are now considering which would cut the number of people down from 20 to 10. I am almost thinking about withdrawing it because it is really meant to be a friendly amendment, thinking it would make it more palatable to the people in the Legislature. Some people have indicated to me that they thought 20 people was too many. I don't have strong feelings about it. Just whatever you desire. I'm trying to make the resolution acceptable to more people. So if you want to vote for 20, vote against my resolution. If you want to vote for ten, vote for it, whatever. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: On lights that we had recognized before we discontinued discussion I had Senator Pirsch. Do you wish to speak? May we have order, please.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Mr. President. I did have a concern as to when this would be and if the number of 20 would disrupt this body while they were in session. Senator Vickers really answered that when he stated that there would be a recess of this body during that time. Other than that, I guess my natural conservative nature wonders whether ten would not be sufficient. But, again, I do not have real strong feelings except as it perhaps would impact on this body if they remained in session while 20 of our body went to Washington, D.C. Thank you.
