

that. But let's take it a step at a time. This step simply makes available to the court, and makes it a part of this Legislature, the entire record of Commonwealth, both the majority report and the minority report. They are all part of it. They can look at it and they can make their own judgement. And, hopefully, the adoption of this will take off any political pressure that might have been put on the court simply by passage of our previous resolution. The court will know we are giving them another signal also and that signal is, no matter what, play it straight, do what is right. That is all I'm asking.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the resolution, LR 41. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted that wish to? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a request for a record vote. (Read record vote found on pages 403 and 404 of the Legislative Journal.) 38 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of LR 41, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The resolution is adopted. Do you have anything else, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a series of items to read in. I have notice of hearing from the Government Committee, signed by Senator Landis; notice of hearing from the Retirement Systems Committee, signed by Senator Harris; notice of hearing from the Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee, signed by Senator Rupp. (Refer to pages 404 and 405 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, I have new resolutions. (Read LR 43-46. See pages 405 through 409 of the Legislative Journal.) All four of those will be laid over, Mr. President.

The last item I have is a unanimous consent request from Senators Hefner and Schmit to allow Public Works to meet in Room 1117 and Miscellaneous Subjects in Room 1517 for their hearings to be conducted tomorrow.

SPEAKER NICHOL: No objection? So ordered.
