I will deal with the proponents of the bill. I'll talk with the Real Estate Commission. I'll work out whatever we can. But I wanted you to know my arguments now so when it comes up on Select File you won't be too surprised. With that, Mr. Speaker, I would like to withdraw my amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The amendment is withdrawn. We have nothing further on the bill, Mr. Clerk? Senator Goodrich, would you like to close? All right. You've heard the discussion on the bill. The question is, shall the bill be advanced? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the advancement of the bill. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
