Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You heard the closing on the bill. The question now is, should the bill advance? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. There are nine excused. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, you might as well have a call of the house.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please return to your desks and record your presence. Sorry, committee under the north balcony. I must call you back to your desks and record your presence please. Senator Beutler, do you want to record your presence, please. Please record your presence, ladies and gentlemen. Senators, under the north balcony, please return to your desks and record your presence. Your rules, not mine. Looking for Rod Johnson. I guess we are all here now, Senator Beutler. Did you want a roll call vote? I didn't hear you. Okay, a roll call vote and the situation is the advancement of LB 171.

CLERK: (Roll call vote commenced.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: (Gavel.) Could we have a little more quiet. We are a little loud with our talk. Thank you.

CLERK: (Roll call vote continued. See pages 722-23 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill fails to advance so we will skip 171A and go to 430, and then following that we will jump to Select File. The call is raised.
