We are voting on something specific and it is significant enough, it is important enough that I don't want to have to go home over the weekend and say, yes, I voted for that resolution, I haven't the vaguest idea if it helps you or not. That isn't doing anybody any favor. It doesn't address anything. So I would move, Mr. President, that the bill be bracketed until Monday until the information that everybody seems to feel, or some people at least seem to feel would be helpful is available. It would seem to me that is a very reasonable request.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to bracket the bill until Monday. Discussion on the motion. Is there objection to bracketing the bill until Monday? Hearing none, so ordered. The Chair would like to recognize the Speaker, Senator Nichol, who has matters for us all to know about. Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, just briefly because it must be brief, we have to knock this off for our Statehood Day celebration, but we must take up Senator Lundy's resolution. I hope it doesn't bring up a lot of conversation. But other than that, you can announce that the TV show tonight at eight o'clock is ETV's program on our Washington trip for those who wish to watch it. That is tonight at eight o'clock. Other than that, thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Speaker, do you want to appoint somebody to relieve me to take over.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Marsh, are you available to preside for a few minutes. Thank you. Yes.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Do you want to go with Senator Lundy's motion, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President...Senator, it seems to me we should do the suspension motion first if that is agreeable with you. And then we will proceed to withdraw the bill. Mr. President, Senator Lundy would move to suspend the rules, specifically Rule 3, Section 13, so as to permit cancellation of the public hearing on LB 648. That motion, Mr. President, is on page 746 of the Journal.
