SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman is next, but may I please introduce some guests of Senator Miller. There are six students from Wilcox Public Schools in the north balcony, accompanied by their teacher. Would you please rise and be recognized by the Legislature. Thank you. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: (Response inaudible.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beutler, then Senator Rod Johnson.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Landis, if I may, or, Senator Warner, if you can answer, with the committee amendments what is the fiscal impact of this bill next year?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, did you wish to respond to that, or Senator Landis, which ever. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: The only change that will be affected next year is that for the Public Service Commission. That is a rise from the current salary of \$25,000 to \$35,000. That means that there will be \$10,000 for each of the Public Service Commissioners. There are...no, I think the current salary is \$25,000, is it not? Yes, the current salary is \$25,000. We are moving to \$35,000 next year. That means \$10,000 times the six members of the Public Service Commission.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So roughly \$60,000 or \$70,000, is that a fair range?

SENATOR LANDIS: Right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: (Microphone not activated) ...is 27, David. You're looking at...

SENATOR BEUTLER: So it's roughly about \$65,000, \$60 to \$65?

SENATOR LANDIS: In that case you're talking about \$40,000.
