

keep track of these licenses. They are under impoundment. And there are no criminal sanctions for driving on an impounded license. And there is one little second change that this bill would make is to raise the penalty for driving on a revoked, suspended or impounded license. That, basically, is it and I ask for its advancement.

PRESIDENT: Senator Labedz, do you wish the floor on this bill? Senator Labedz, do you wish the floor on LB 356?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to ask Senator Peterson a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Peterson.

SENATOR PETERSON: Yes.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Hoagland and Senator Haberman and I are discussing LB 356 and also LB 626. In LB 356 there is no provision whatsoever that a worker's permit would be allowed for someone that was charged with say drunken driving and drives a truck, he would not be able to drive a truck or any worker on any job, 626 would allow a worker's permit. LB 356 does not. Am I correct?

SENATOR PETERSON: I believe you are right.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Senator Peterson.

PRESIDENT: Is there further...? Senator Haberman. Any further discussion on LB 356? The motion is to advance the bill from General File. All those in favor vote yes, opposed vote no. Please record your vote. The motion is to advance LB 356 from General File to Enrollment and Review. May we have the attention of members of the Legislature who may not be in the Chamber. Consent calendar could move more quickly if we have your attention. Have you all voted on the motion to advance LB 356? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance LB 356, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 356 is advanced. LB 33.
