SPEAKER NICHOL: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Debate is ceased. Senator Morehead, close? Senator Morehead, please.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: I move for the advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, opposed nay. Five are excused. Did you ask for a record vote, or not? I didn't hear. Okay. Senator Morehead asks for a record vote. So if you vote, please do so. Mr. Clerk, record please.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1260-61 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 14 nays on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. Do you have anything to put into the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, Senator Beutler would like to print amendments to 496; Senator DeCamp to 280. I have an Attorney General's opinion to Senator Smith, and, Mr. President, Senator Abboud would like to add his name to 559 as co-introducer; and Constitutional Revision and Recreation reports LR 16CA indefinitely postponed, and LR 30CA to General File with amendments attached.
