SPEAKER NICHOL: Were you through, Senator Vickers? Does that mean yes or no?

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LB 28, LB 33, LB 235, LB 265, LB 308, LB 335, LB 340, LB 373, LB 423, LB 424, LB 547, LB 568, LB 625, LB 94 and LB 487. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Hefner, if I may, I also am trying to get a handle and understand what is going on here a little bit. In the committee amendments you apparently on page 3 strike the words, "anything of value", at the top of page 3 of the green copy. What is the purpose and effect of that particular striking?

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Beutler.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, Senator Beutler. Senator Beutler, Senator Hefner is ready to respond.

SENATOR HEFNER: What was your question again?

SENATOR BEUTLER: What is the intent and effect of eliminating the language, "anything of value", at the top of page 3 of the green copy which is the...which is item number two on your committee amendments?

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes, this would be so that they could give them napkins and glasses and a few of the incidentals.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, can I ask you as a matter of general philosophy as far as this bill is concerned, the committee amendments also strike the requirement of listing prices with the commission. Is that right?

SENATOR HEFNER: Correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: All right, and now what is happening to the pricing system under this bill? What's the general philosophy of this bill in terms of the pricing system now?

SENATOR HEFNER: This would be so that each one would be
