LB 213, 341

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: LB 341.

CLERK: Senator, on 341 I have E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I would move the E & R amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried. Amendments are adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Senator.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I move that LB 341 be advanced from Select File to E & R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 341. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried, the bill is advanced. LB 213.

CLERK: Mr. President, on 213 I have no E & R amendments to the bill, Senator. I do have a motion to indefinitely postpone offered by Senator DeCamp. That would lay the bill over unless the introducer agrees to take it up at this time.

PRESIDENT: Where is Senator DeCamp? Senator Wesely, what is your wish on the motion of Senator DeCamp to indefinitely postpone? Do you wish to take it up now or lay it over?

SENATOR WESELY: Oh, certainly, let's take it up.

PRESIDENT: Very well. The motion is to indefinitely postpone LB 213. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, let me ask Senator Wesely a question before I even move very far on it because it may not be necessary. Would you be willing to accept an amendment on there that strikes that last...the last sentence, you know, the controversial sentence? If you would, I would drop the kill motion, support the amendment
