

with less than what we brought there. But to say that the other side agreed to have their bill killed is facetious at best. There was no misunderstanding or hoodwinking of anybody. The only provision in the bill that offers something different is that last sentence. And let's forget the NLRB. Let's forget the NLRA. Let's forget other states and everybody else and look at what is before us. We are establishing by this bill a policy. Now should the policy of the state be that somebody who spends most of their time with one group nevertheless be classified with the other group? That is what the issue is. And all this other talk can be engaged in as long as we want to. Senator DeCamp acknowledged that he doesn't know what is to become of the person who spends most of his or her time with the bargaining unit. He agreed they are not a supervisor and we all know they are not a supervisor because if that is what they were, they would be called the supervisor and we wouldn't have the problem. We have a situation where certain people who are part of a bargaining unit and are paid as workers and viewed as workers nevertheless are to be put in a category where they can be snitches and informers.

SPEAKER NICHOL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: They don't enjoy the prerogatives or the privileges of the upper class but they are to do the dirty work of the upper class by carrying the upper classes' messages and doing the hatchet jobs on the workers such as themselves. If the person is a supervisor, let them be deemed a supervisor and paid as a supervisor. If they are not a supervisor and there is only one other category, put them in the category where they belong. That is all that 213 says. We know that judges will make decisions which some people feel are legislation but it is not the job of the court to legislate. Even though on occasion their opinions result in that practical effect, they still are the judiciary and don't become members of the Legislature who can offer bills or vote on them on this floor. So even if these workers on occasion do things that have the appearance or create the illusion...
