

it is written right now and I think Senator Sieck's intention is to make possession of an open container anywhere in the vehicle illegal. So I think we're going to need some language changes, maybe on Select File, to clarify that and I think also on Select File we may need some language changes and make it clear that if the open container is contained in a trunk, in Senator Marsh's situation, that is all right, a locked trunk, and then finally we're going to need some language changes to take care of the station wagon situation where you might have a case of champagne in the back of the station wagon, a couple bottles of which have been opened, you can't put them in a locked trunk because there is no locked trunk. Obviously we don't want to make that illegal. So with those caveats and with those need for I think a probably a pretty comprehensive rewrite of the bill at some point to make it clear we're doing what we want to do, why I would support the Sieck amendment and support the committee amendments and hope we advance the bill because I think this is a policy change that we very much need to effectuate in the State of Nebraska.
