SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, so ordered. Do you have anything else on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right, Senator Wesely, we are back on the bill.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, will this be the closing then, or is there...?

SPEAKER NICHOL: I have no other lights on. Are there others who wish to speak on the bill? If not, this will be the closing, Senator Wesely, since we have no other lights on.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. We have talked about the issue a great deal and I appreciate Senator Conway and Senator Morehead, both of which have had legitimate amendments offered and withdrawn.
