

SENATOR DECAMP: I suspect she is ready to take a vote. Yes.

CLERK: Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR DECAMP: She's ready to take a vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Pirsch, would you like to speak for yourself, or not?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Morehead.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: I'd like a call of the house.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. We'll see...now, Senator Morehead, so that you know what we are doing, this is debatable, first. Yes, it's debatable. So, I want you to know that. We'll run through the lights, see if anybody wants to discuss it. Senator Wesely, is it all right with you to go ahead? Senator Chambers, we have lights on, so I must have...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All I wanted was Senator Morehead or somebody to make a motion to advance so that it's clear what we are calling the house on, and what we will be voting on.
