arguing against the bill is that there are a lot of uninsureds out there. They, in many cases, are not going to be able to subrogate against another insurance company when someone else is at fault if in fact that person doesn't have insurance. I know some of that is reflected in part of our premium now. I think in the long haul that the various costs associated with actuarial procedures would find themselves washing out and we would find ourselves in a situation where we should or probably will not find any cost variation whatsoever and yet have done a better job of spreading those risks. So with that, I would ask that the body advance the bill to Select File.
