Senator Goll. Okay, Mr. Clerk, we are all here except for those excused. Call the roll. The motion before the body is the advancement of LB 645. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1397-98 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 17 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The bill fails to advance. At that point, Senator Johnson, I think we should pass over the A bill and, Mr. Clerk, what is the next item of business?

CLERK: Mr. President, if I might right before that, I have some items to read in. Mr. President, Senator Hoagland has amendments to 146; and Senator Vard Johnson to 157.
