SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes, I want to move the bill. Well, I gave a stirring closing on the last amendment and there were 17 folks stirred and 25 that were not. Well, I would laugh too. I would be embarrassed. But let's move this bill across because again we have an obligation to keep faith with the children. Senator Pappas came over to me as the last vote was being cast and he reminded me of a small point which I would like to make very quickly, that a couple of days ago we moved LB 112 which would increase the gasoline tax one cent and that would be a \$9 million increase in the gasoline tax and that money would go out for new highways and roads for cities and counties and it was real easy to move that bill. That's a \$9 million bill. I don't know how many miles of roads and streets \$9 million buys, but I don't think very many, maybe three or four miles at best. And at this juncture this bill has got a price tag of \$1.3 million and, surely, our children are worth at least a half a mile of road because that is about what the comparison really is. With that, I would move to advance LB 632 as amended.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, the motion is the advancement of LB 632 as amended. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.

CLERK: Senator Beutler voting yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Please vote. Okay, is there anybody else that wishes to vote? Record, Mr. Clerk.
