PRESIDENT: May we have order in the Chamber, please. Attention to the speaker. (Gavel.) Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the body, I voted on the affirmative side to IPP this bill, but after thinking about it and stewing over it and worrying about it, I feel that maybe I was a little hasty and possibly some other members of the body might have been a little hasty because this is a very, very serious issue and I feel that we should have another opportunity to have some discussion and some debate. There have been some new facts and figures that are compiled and, therefore, I would like to ask this body to please give us the opportunity to reconsider LB 60 and then whatever happens we will live with the decision of the body. I would like to ask the privilege to have the body reconsider this issue. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are you asking a question of Senator Schmit? Senator Schmit, you are recognized.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I rise in support of the motion by Senator Haberman to reconsider the action on LB 60. I believe it is a very important bill. If the bill is reconsidered, I do have an amendment which will limit the scope of LB 60 even further than it was previously.
