Senator Chambers, Senator Beutler, Senator Goodrich, Senator Rod Johnson, Senator Lamb and Senator Withem. We're looking for Senator Withem, Senator Rod Johnson, Senator Goodrich. Okay, we are all here. We are voting on the advancement of the bill. And roll call has been asked for. Proceed, Mr. Clerk.
