PRESIDENT: Now on to the priority bills, LB 157 on General File.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 157 was a bill introduced by the Banking Committee and signed by its member. (Read title.) The bill was referred to the Banking Committee for hearing, was advanced to General File with committee amendments attached. The committee amendments were adopted by the Legislature, Mr. President, on February 21. There was also an amendment by Senator Conway to the bill that was adopted. There was a motion to bracket the bill by Senator Haberman that prevailed. There was then a motion on March 1st that was adopted to the bill offered by Senator Higgins. There was amendments from Senators Lundy, Hannibal, and DeCamp adopted to the bill. The next amendments I have, Mr. President, are by Senator Landis. Senator, I understand you wish to withdraw these, is that right? Okay, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Vard Johnson who is excused.
