LB 97, 606A

Senator Hartnett. (Read. See page 1624 of the Legislative Journal.) That will be laid over.

Mr. President, the next bill is 606A. I have no amendments on the bill, Senator.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I would move that LB 606A be advanced from Select File to E & R for engrossment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The motion is the advancement of LB 606A to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor say aye. Opposed. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next bill is LB 97. Senator Hall, I do have...I am sorry, Senator, I don't have E & R amendments. I do have an amendment. Senator Schmit, you had amendments on page 1059, Senator. I understand you wish to withdraw those.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes. I have amendments on 1307, Mr. President.

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to amend the bill. Those amendments are on page 1307.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the amendment which I have does three things. First of all, it creates the Livestock Market Auction Board. It makes certain that that board is responsible for the automatic termination of the license of a market that is not in operation and that the administrative agency handles it in that manner. Secondly, it provides that...and clarifies the language as to when the license shall terminate and provides for the method of appeal of the termination of the license. Third, it says that if there is not an auction conducted within the past 12 months that the license shall be automatically terminated. I move the adoption of the amendments.

SENATOR BEUTLER: There are no further lights on. Senator Schmit, do you wish to make further comment on your amendment?

SENATOR SCHMIT: No further comment, Mr. President.
