

Scofield.

PRESIDENT: Senator Scofield, do you have an amendment to 457?

SENATOR SCOFIELD: I think I would just as soon wait until Select File for this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Very well.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is by Senator Haberman. Senator Haberman would move to bracket the bill until January 15, 1986.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Haberman. May we have order in the Chamber, please. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the body, I have a question of Senator Vickers, please.

SENATOR VICKERS: Certainly.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Vickers, is it your intent to try to amend the bill on Select File or leave it in the present form?

SENATOR VICKERS: Senator Haberman, as I indicated earlier, it is my intent to bracket the bill till next year on Select File and at that time a year from now we will probably have to amend the bill to reflect whatever it is that we have found out from the Department of Labor at the federal level, in the meantime, or kill the bill if it becomes clearly the fact that the federal government has preempted this area.

SENATOR HABERMAN: A question of Senator Scofield, please.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Okay.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Scofield, would you wait for your amendment if the bill is bracketed on Select File until next year?

SENATOR SCOFIELD: I think I would just as soon advance the bill, Senator Haberman, right now and then hold it on Select.
