

record your vote on LB 183. Have you all voted? The Chair will allow 15 seconds for you to record your vote. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1718-19 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 14 nays, 4 excused and not voting, 5 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill fails to pass with the emergency clause attached. Now the question is...

CLERK: I have a motion, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I would like to stop the train. This is a bill that completely rewrites the liquor laws. It is imperative I get it with the E clause, therefore, I am willing to accept an amendment that is the offending amendment that deals with five percent of the bill, and hopefully Senator Landis will put up a motion. Has he put it up?

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR DECAMP: Then let's do that.

PRESIDENT: Motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis would move to return the bill for specific amendment. (Read Landis amendment found on page 1719 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, on Select File this was the source of some controversy. The bill moved to Final Reading. I share Senator DeCamp's desire to see this bill passed this year with the E clause attached. I, perhaps like others in this room, have had constituent contact. There is a tail to this dog and a tail that is an offending tail. I would just as soon cut the tail off and allow the dog to skip free. It requires striking the language in the bill, and perhaps Senator DeCamp will identify the language for us, the appropriate lines in the bill. It is on page 19 of the bill, line 21
