

CLERK: Yes, sir.

PRESIDENT: Does anyone wish to speak on this amendment now? It is debatable. If not, the motion is to adopt the amendment that has been offered by Senator Landis. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 2 nays on adoption of the Landis amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Motion prevails. Now we have to have another motion...

CLERK: Readvance the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: ...to readvance the bill. Senator Landis, do you want to readvance the bill.

SENATOR LANDIS: (Response inaudible.)

PRESIDENT: Motion is to readvance the bill to Enrollment and Review for engrossment. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is readvanced. The Chair would take this opportunity to introduce some guests on behalf of Senator Richard Peterson. I introduce them for him because they are from his district.
