

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted that Senator Rupp offered for Senator Withem.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis would move to amend. (See amendment on page 1951 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I had handwritten a note and I have not gotten it appropriately done by the bill drafter to add the word "reasonable" to "notice". As I said in the case of a public hearing, notice will be given to police officer and fire fighter. It is common usage in legal parlance to use the phrase "reasonable notice" so that one may not receive a letter in the morning for a public hearing in the evening and claim that that is in fact reasonable notice. Unfortunately, I made that addition with handwriting and did not get the appropriate form to have that drawn up. I would ask for the addition of that one word into the amendment previously adopted. The phrase would then read "after giving reasonable notice."

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the Landis proposal? If not, the motion is to adopt the Landis amendment as explained. All those in favor vote yes, opposed vote no. The machine malfunctioned. If you will vote again please, yes or no. Voting on the Landis amendment to 372. Please record your vote. The motion is the adoption of the Landis amendment to LB 372. We had a malfunction. If some of you voted once, you may need to check to see if you voted again please, vote yes or no on the Landis amendment to LB 372. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Landis's amendment to LB 372, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Now what do we have on the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.
