CLERK: 9 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence, and those outside the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. How many excused, Mr. Clerk? Five are excused, Senator Hartnett. Senator Pirsch, would you record your presence please. Senator Nelson. Senator Chambers. Senator Hartnett, did you want to authorize call in votes or not? We are voting on the advancement of the bill and call in votes are authorized.

CLERK: Senator Marsh voting yes. Senator Vickers voting yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Conway. Senator Higgins, record your presence please. A roll call vote has been asked for, Senator Higgins, so we will be conducting that in a moment. Thank you, though. Senator Rogers seems to be the one we are looking for. One more, Senator Schmit is excused. Okay, we have a roll call vote now on the advancement of the bill. Will you please hold it down so the Clerk can hear your response. (Gavel.) Roll call vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President.
