

selling it under the same label, therefore, circumventing that 60 cents a gallon tax and actually producing 500,000 gallons a year. Now Senator Scofield says it is okay if they join together and I agree. As a matter of fact, there is nothing to prevent them from forming a partnership, or corporation, or whatever, and applying for one license. But that one license then would be limiting them to the 50,000 gallon which I think is the intent of the bill. I don't think the intent is to allow a group of individuals or to allow Mogen-David or Taylor's or somebody to come in here and contract with 50 farmers and tell each farmer, if you will produce up to 50,000 gallon but all bottle it under our label that you can get by for 5 cents a gallon and I think that is what the law is saying as it is drafted. I think that is what it would allow. Now maybe there are those of you that would disagree with that, but I think even the introducers of the bill have indicated that they don't really have a problem with saying it this way but I think what they are saying is they want to pass the bill today. I don't think they want it reprinted again. We still have 21 days left. The bill is still going to get passed. I just suggest that before we pass the bill we have it in the...make certain that it is in the correct form and I really don't buy the argument that this is a model bill and other states have done it. You know, other states have made mistakes in the past, too. They still have got two-house Legislatures. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to return the bill to Select File for a specific amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the motion to return to Select File for a specific amendment? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

PRESIDENT: Proceed to read LB 279.

CLERK: (Read LB 279 on Final Reading.)
