So with that, I would urge your adoption of the bracketing motion. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the bill be bracketed? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. It takes 25. Three are excused now. Senator Beyer.

SENATOR BEYER: Mr. Speaker, let's quit wasting time and have a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return and record your presence. Please record your presence. Several of you are here but have not pushed your green button. Senator Lynch, Senator Landis, Senator Hefner. Okay, roll call vote has been asked and we are voting on the bracketing of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Mr. Clerk. All right, we are voting on the bracketing of the bill. Mr. Clerk.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I raise the call.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.
