SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beyer please.

SENATOR BEYER: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, once again it is my privilege to be able to introduce a resolution honoring all modes of transportation. It is kind of unusual when I can get up and talk for all modes when I generally stick with motor carrier but this is one time of the year that the Governor has proclaimed next week as Transportation Week and I just urge the Legislature to pass the same resolution and extend it to the transportation industry. Thank you.

SENATOR BEYER: Well, it could. It is a little bit out of date but I don't think there is any members in the transportation industry at the time with that.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right, the question is the adoption of LR 253. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of LR 253, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The resolution is adopted. LR 254 please.

CLERK: 254 offered by Senator Scofield, found on page 2021, says nice things, Mr. President, about the City of Chadron.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. You will notice that I have three resolutions right in a row here this morning. Northwest Nebraska is beginning to celebrate its 100th anniversary. You may recall in January we commended the City of Gordon for celebrating its 100th anniversary.
