

in favor vote aye, opposed no. This takes 25 votes.  
Senator Marsh voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Marsh voting yes.

SENATOR MARSH: The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Smith's  
amendment to the bill, Madam President.

SENATOR MARSH: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, the next motion I have is...Senator  
Withem, the amendment you had printed, Senator, on 1990 I  
understand you want to withdraw.

SENATOR WITHEM: Correct.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Withem would move to amend  
the bill. (See Withem amendment found on page 2088 of the  
Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: Madam President, I think this is, at this  
point, the last of the amendments at least that I am aware  
of to the bill. This is one that fits in that category of  
technical amendment that is a little bit more than what  
E & R could do, but isn't much more than that, but it is  
important that we do adopt this amendment. Under current  
Nebraska law when an individual is going to be 18 on  
election day, let's assume that the election is November 5,  
that individual is going to turn 18 on November 4, it is  
permissible for that person to register to vote long before  
November 4. Inadvertently in the drafting of this bill that  
provision that allowed the person to register early was  
stricken. What this amendment does is it reinserts that  
language so that if this amendment is adopted it will once  
again be possible for an individual who turns 18 prior to  
election day, but is not actually 18 at the time they  
register, to register to vote. I would urge you to adopt  
this amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: We are now ready to vote on the amendment  
which Senator Withem has just explained. All those in favor  
vote yes, opposed no. This takes 25 votes. Have you all
