

SENATOR WARNER: Well, Mr. President, the committee did not recommend the transfer. It is \$15,000. I forget the exact amount of money that is already in for judges training. It is our recommendation that it didn't need to be spent, it ought to be lapsed, which is what would otherwise occur. Needless to say, there are substantial financial problems facing the state and I appreciate that 15,000 isn't a whole lot of money, but if we keep adding funds, we are further complicating what is probably a far more difficult problem than most people want to acknowledge at the moment. I am not aware...I know there are some new judges but there are also some funds available currently for judges training and it was the committee's feeling that that was adequate funds as it is.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on Senator Hefner's amendment? Anything further Senator Hefner?

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I would just urge you to support this amendment. The money was used for the cost of training judges and some of it was also paid for the expenses of judges and also for transportation, and so at this time, I would just ask you to support the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Motion is the adoption of the amendment offered by Senator Hefner and a couple of others to the deficiency appropriations bills. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote on the amendment. The Chair will allow 20 seconds for you to record your vote please. We are voting on an amendment offered to the deficiency appropriations bill by Senator Hefner. Please record your vote. Ten seconds. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 5 ayes, 14 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is not adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to amend the bill.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Haberman.
