

of themselves legal. They are caffeine tablets. They are other kinds of relatively harmless drugs, and they become illegal only when they are packaged to look like look-alike drugs and when they are settled with representations that they are look-alike drugs and we have discussed those problems previously on the floor. We have now, over a several week period, done what we can to cure the constitutional problems and presented this rewrite of the bill. The relevant criteria are on pages 12 and 13 of the rewrite. I think they speak for themselves. We are hopeful that this will put most of the constitutional questions to rest. The bill will clearly be litigated. The ultimate decision will be up to the Nebraska Supreme Court as to whether it is constitutional but we have done as good a job as we can in this body to fashion a constitutional law which a number of other states throughout the Midwest and throughout the country have done. We would ask your adoption of these amendments. Thank you, Mr. President.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Hoagland, do you want to readvance the bill?
