LB 280A, 447, 496, 516

PRESIDENT: Your time is expiring.

SENATOR DECAMP: But if you noticed, the first thing they did this morning was say, but we're not going to cut it out of state employees because they have a strong lobbying group and we're not going to cut it out of muny court because, don't kid yourself, you've got a half cent sales tax increase coming. We're going to do it right eventually and you know it and I know it, but right now the right thing to do is override this veto.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to override the...to pass LB 280A despite the Governor's veto, 30 votes required. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote. The Chair will allow 20 seconds for you to record your vote. Ten seconds. Okay, please record your vote. Have you all voted? Please record. Have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Please record your vote. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on page 2215 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 14 nays, 6 excused and not voting, 7 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Now do you have anything for the record at the present time? The call of the house is raised. Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would like to print amendments to 447; Senator Schmit to 496. That is all that I have. (See pages 2215-21 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Is Senator Schmit present? What is the Speaker's wish on Legislative...Mr. Speaker, what is your wish on LR 35? Senator Schmit apparently has not arrived yet.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Why don't we pass over it until he arrives if he is not here.

PRESIDENT: Very well. We will pass over and go to General File then, LB 516. LB 516 is in what condition, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, 516 was a bill that was originally
