CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 2269-70 of the Legislative Journal.) 44 ayes, 0 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

CLERK: (Read LB 432 on Final Reading.)

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 2270-2271 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 15 nays, 2 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.
