

programs. Had we reduced those, they would merely automatically increase the deficit next time. Local transit was 18,000; aid to libraries, 5,700; Soil and Water Conservation Fund, 19,000; Resource Development fund, 12,500; area agencies for the aging, 14,000; Council of State Governments, \$1,169; law enforcement, Indian affairs, \$1,600; and waste water treatment, 18,000. The total of those excluding the two that was mentioned would be about 1,900,000. In the discussion the committee felt when we went back looking for reductions that some reduction was appropriate for the aid programs as well as state operations. The figure that...the percentage that the committee proposed to suggest is 1 percent and I would move its adoption.
