

reduce aid to counties by 166,600, and then the next one is on page 3 of the amendment, item 10, to vote separately to reduce the aid for mental retardation programs for \$210,484. And the last one that has been asked to be considered separate is the aid to technical community colleges found on page 5. It is amendment 18 in the amount of 236,134.

SENATOR BARRETT: May I review these again one more time please.

SENATOR WARNER: Certainly.

SENATOR BARRETT: Aid to counties, separate; aid to education; high school tuition reimbursement; mental retardation; technical community colleges; and the school lunch.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes. Actually the state aid to schools, high school tuition, the school lunch is a single amendment. It is all in the same program.

SENATOR BARRETT: So school lunch is included in Program #143, high school tuition reimbursement?

SENATOR WARNER: Right.

SENATOR BARRETT: Okay, thank you very much, Senator Warner. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, did you wish to close please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, the only issue is whether or not in the process of attempting to reduce the overall budget, if aid programs are to be included, it is our recommendation that there should be no exclusions with the exception of the three identified, and in those cases, you merely add to the deficit if you reduce them at this point. So I would move adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is...Senator Barrett, your light is still on. Did you wish to speak again? Okay, the question is the adoption of the Warner amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
