CLERK: Yes, sir. May I read some things in, Mr. President?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes.

CLERK: Mr. President, new resolution, LR 290, by Senators Landis, Nelson, Withem, Marsh, Pappas, asking the Legislature to voice to Congress their opposition to the transfer of the independent federal Railroad Unemployment Insurance System to the federal/state system. That will be laid over. (See pages 2539-40 of the Legislative Journal.)

LR 291 by Senators Conway and Hefner, asking the State Historical Society, the Indian Commission and other appropriate agencies be authorized to work toward the goal of preserving and marking the cemetery area of the Standing Bear family and other members of the Ponca tribe. That will be laid over. (See pages 2540-41 of the Legislative Journal.)

Senator Landis has amendments to 548 and Senator Higgins to 600. (See page 2541 of the Legislative Journal.)

LR 250 which had been referred to the Government Committee for hearing has been reported back to the Legislature, Mr. President. That is offered by Senator Landis as Chair of the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. (See page 2541 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, the next amendment to 722 is by Senator Vickers. (The Vickers amendment appears on page 2542 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Members, this is an amendment that is a little bit different than the others that you have had so far today. This is not one to add back any funds. It is to shift some funds within an agency from one program to another. If you recall correctly, yesterday I suggested that perhaps we should give more discretion to the agency directors, the people who are responsible for managing these programs as they attempt to deal with these cuts.
