CLERK: (Continues to read LB 653 on Final Reading.)

PPRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 653 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote on the final passage of LB 653 with the emergency clause. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? CLERK: (Record vote read.) 44 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting, 4 present and not voting, Mr. President. (Vote appears on pages 2713-14 of the Legislative Journal.)

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Vard Johnson would move to return 653A to Select File for a specific amendment, that amendment being to strike the enacting clause.
