SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill fails to advance. Do you have anything to put in the record, Mr. Clerk? New bills?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, new bills. (Read LB 1031-1033 by title for the first time as found on pages 331-32 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, I have a reference report referring LB 988 along with a notice of hearing.

Your Committee on Enrolment and Review reports LB 745 to Select File; 746, 747, 748, 749, 750 and 546 all to Select File, some of which have E & R amendments attached. (See pages 328-31 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: We'll move on to...incidentally, I do appreciate your attention and your very good debate on the last bill. It was good and I'm proud of you. We'll move on to Senator Hoagland's bill, 529.

CLERK: Mr. President, 529 was a bill offered by Senator Hoagland. (Title read.) The bill was first read on January 22 of last year, referred to the Judiciary Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Judiciary Committee amendments pending.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hoagland, are you going to take up the amendments first. All right.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes, let me say a word about the bill and the amendments, if I can, together, Mr. Speaker, because I think it will help explain things. LB 529 was brought to us by the Court Administrator's Office and it was designated as a priority bill by the Judiciary Committee, and after a hearing and after some revision in the Judiciary Committee, we reported it to the floor. We advanced it on a seven to nothing vote with one legislator not present at the time of the vote in Executive Session. Now this bill is basically a technical bill although it is an important technical bill from the point of view of the operation of the judicial
